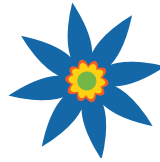

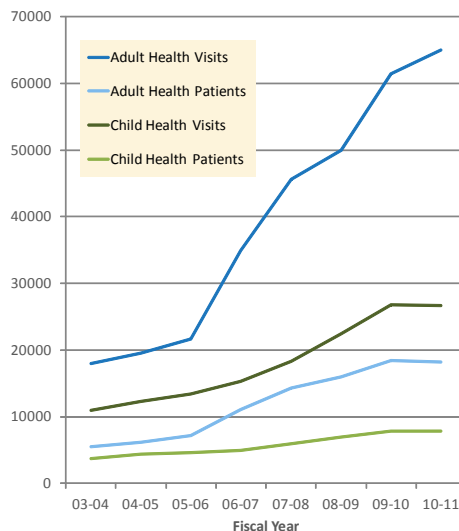
About Community Health Center of North Port

Community Health Center of North Port, Inc. (CHCNP) is a private/public partnership that provides caring and culturally competent health care for residents of Sarasota County regardless of their financial status. In 2012, all of the Florida Department of Health in Sarasota County's primary health care services became part of CHCNP.

The CHCNP makes a significant economic contribution to Sarasota County. In fiscal year 2011-12, it employed 276 individuals with a payroll of \$11,850,000. The majority of these employees live in our community. It also collected \$14,050,000 in revenue generated from insurance and client payments. The oldest of CHCNP's service locations, Ringling Health Center in downtown Sarasota, has been in operation for more than 60 years and has been instrumental in meeting the growing demand for affordable health care through practice management and site expansion.

Since its inception, CHCNP has experienced extraordinary growth. Expansion plans include the addition of pediatrics and behavioral health services to the William L. Little Health & Human Services Center (downtown Sarasota). Additionally, the Glasser-Schoenbaum Human Services Center is engaged in a campaign to erect a new 12,000 square foot building on their 17th Street campus for the Children's Health Center in recognition that it had seriously outgrown its existing space.
