## Residents encouraged to stay safe and healthy this Memorial Day Weekend

SARASOTA COUNTY — The Florida Department of Health in Sarasota County (DOH-Sarasota) encourages all residents and visitors to keep health and safety a priority while enjoying this Memorial Day weekend. Simple

awareness and precautions can help families have fun without the interruption of injury or illness.

Local health and county officials say Memorial Day weekend is an opportunity to enjoy our local amenities while spending time with family and friends, but you should remember to include healthy choices such as fresh foods, physical activity, and protection from mosquito-borne diseases and the ultraviolet rays of the sun.

DOH-Sarasota offers the following tips for ensuring a healthy and safe Memorial Day:

- Drink plenty of water, especially when enjoying caffeinated beverages or alcohol. Try to reduce the amount of sugar-sweetened beverages you consume.
- Be sure to keep cold foods cold. Place leftovers in iced coolers or the refrigerator right away to prevent foodborne illnesses.



- Mosquitoes tend to be active during dawn and dusk. To minimize exposure to mosquitos and the diseases they cause, cover up. Wear shoes, socks, long pants, and long sleeves. You may also apply mosquito repellent to bare skin and clothing. Always use repellents according to the label. Repellents with DEET, picaridin, oil of lemon. eucalyptus and IR3535 are effective. Use mosquito netting to protect children younger than 2 months.
- Use high SPF sunscreen before catching rays or playing outside. Reapply often, especially on children.
