Sarasota County Health Department receives Susan G. Komen for the Cure grant

The Florida Suncoast Affiliate of Susan G. Komen for the Cure has awarded the Sarasota County Health Department a grant of \$25,032 to support the continuation of the Be Smart Mammogram Program

The Be Smart Mammogram Program allows eligible women in southern Sarasota County to receive a free, annual screening mammogram, breast health education and follow-up care, if needed. Women who meet the eligibility requirements listed below may participate in the program without a physician's order:

- 40 to 49 years of age
- reside in southern Sarasota County (Osprey and areas south to North Port).
- have no source of health insurance or means to pay for a screening mammogram.

Mammograms help detect breast cancer and can save lives. The American Cancer Society and National Institutes for Health recommend that women, ages 40 and older, have a regularly scheduled mammogram. Women are advised to talk with their health care provider about how often they should receive a mammogram.

"The women served through the Be Smart Mammogram Program have appreciated the caring and supportive staff, and have peace of mind in being able to access mammogram screening and follow-up medical treatment, when necessary," said the program's manager, Theresa Merrill, a registered nurse.

The Florida Suncoast Affiliate of Susan G. Komen for the Cure fully funds the Be Smart Mammogram Program.
