A schedule of the free HIV testing sites and dates is at the end of this release.

Local organizations mobilize to reduce HIV/AIDS in the black community

Local organizations working year-round to reduce the impact of HIV/AIDS in the black community will offer free HIV education and testing at various locations in early February, as part of the 11th annual National Black HIV/AIDS Awareness Day observance. This year's theme, "it Takes a Village to Fight HIV/AIDS," focuses on educating, empowering and mobilizing the local black community in the fight against HIV/AIDS.

A local grassroots organization, Second Chance-Last Opportunity, will host "Taking Steps," a free event that will allow people to get free HIV testing as well as education and counseling on how to prevent the spread of HIV infection on Thursday, Feb. 10, from 3-9 p.m. at its office, 1933 Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Way in Sarasota. On the same day, Thursday, Feb. 10 from 3-6 p.m., free HIV testing, and food will be available at Newtown Selby Goodwill, 1781 Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Way. Thirty minute phone cards will be given as an incentive to every person that gets tested. This event is being sponsored by the Community AIDS Network (CAN), Sarasota County Health Department, Second Chance Last Opportunity, Hedges Pharmacy and the Multicultural Health Institute.

"We are urging everyone to get educated about the way HIV/AIDS is spread, know your HIV status by getting tested, get involved in local community prevention efforts, and get treated if you are currently living with HIV or are newly diagnosed," said Dr. Lisa Merritt, executive director of the Multicultural Health Institute, which developed the Gatekeepers of Community Health Project. Through this effort, community volunteers are trained and equipped to provide HIV testing and education at community events and existing testing sites in the community.

"Working together with the HIV/AIDS Network of Southwest Florida member organizations including Second Chance-Last Opportunity, Community AIDS Network, Sarasota County Health Department, the Multicultural Health Institute as well as community-focused organizations such as Hedges Pharmacy, we can reduce the stigma and help folks to see that HIV infection and AIDS are now viewed by the medical community as a chronic disease, like diabetes or high blood pressure," added Dr. Merritt.

AIDS can be treated with drugs to slow the progression of the disease; however, too often HIV status is diagnosed after the infection has progressed to the point of needing emergency room care. "Knowing your HIV status can help you get into medical treatment earlier, take steps to stay healthy, and keep from spreading the virus to others," said Sarasota County Health Department medical director Dr. William Heymann.

"HIV testing is fast and easy. If you have never been tested, or have had unprotected sex or shared a needle since your last test, now is the time to get an HIV test – it's the only way to be sure," said Dr. Merritt.
